***Descriptions for PUAD “Topics” Courses**

PUAD 694: Topics in Public Admin: Sustainable Transportation

Instructor: Bradley Lane (Associate Professor)

This course investigates the role of transportation in urban society. The course examines the processes of planning, policy-making and implementation, and professional practice in transportation through a sustainability lens by treating sustainability as an integral part of transportation. Content areas include modes of transport, investment and policies in transportation, spatial relations in transportation, interactions between transportation and land use, and how sustainability concepts interact with policy, market forces, and personal behavior in transportation. Students will develop a holistic understanding of how transportation – and their own personal travel behaviors – influences and is influenced by our physical, social, economic, and institutional environments. The course will help prepare students for future focused study and careers in transportation, planning, sustainability, and other related topics. The course will also enhance student skills in professional communication, critical thinking, research, and analysis.

PUAD 839: Topics in Public Admin: Data Analytics in Public Organizations

Instructor: Alfred Ho (Professor)

The course is an introductory course to data analytics in public administration and policy analysis. It examines the potential benefits and applications of data analytics such as machine learning, the political, legal, organizational, and ethical challenges of data analytics usage, and the professional responsibilities of public administrators in using these tools. The course takes a project-oriented learning approach in covering these topics. Students are expected to be familiar with basic statistical analysis and have already taken MPA-level statistics or an equivalent course.

This course satisfies an elective requirement for students who are completing the Performance Management certificate. Students must have completed PUAD 836 or have consent of instructor to enroll.

PUAD 939: Topics in Public Admin: Street Level Bureaucracy

Instructor: Steven Maynard-Moody (Professor)

With the publication of his book in 1980, *Street-Level Bureaucracy: Dilemmas of the Individual in Public Services*, Michael Lipsky altered the direction of scholarship in public policy and public administration. Street-Level Bureaucracy Theory has also influenced scholarship in Social Welfare, Education, and Criminal Justice. (This book has been cited 5700 times, and ASPA identified it as one of the most influential works in public policy.)

In the 30-plus years since its publication, the role of public and privatized front-line workers in implementing and defining public policy remains a lively area of research. This seminar will cover the core literature in the field, but also focus on current streams of work.
